EPOPA

EPOPA (Export Promotion of Organic Products from Africa) is funded by Sida and the goal is to increase income through exports of organic products. In order to build local capacity, a training course is one of the activities executed within EPOPA.

The training is implemented by Grolink AB, a Swedish based consultancy company with expertise in organic agriculture.



Target group

The target group consists of key persons who are seriously interested in developing organic projects or programmes, supporting structures (i.e. extension service, organic sector body etc.) or policies in the country.

The training will be conducted in English and is only open for residents from Tanzania.

Costs

The training fee is 20 000 TSh per participant. That includes training material, accommodation and food. Each participant cover their own insurance and travel cost to and from the venue. (No daily allowance).

Content

The training will consist of lectures, study visits, group work and individual project in

- Organic Agriculture production
- Framework of organic agriculture
- Markets for organic products
- Standards, certification and regulation
- How to set up an organic project



During the training the participants will work with a plan for an organic project. The participants are expected to implement the plan after the training.
